



Objectives and Corporate Structure

AROSE is a public company limited by guarantee.

It is not for profit and all investments are directed toward the achievement of the objects of AROSE.

The objects of the company as outlined in the Constitution are:

- (a) to lead the development of a sustainable sovereign remote operations industry which services multiple market sectors including space, resources, energy, agriculture, medical, defence and others both domestically and internationally;
- (b) to drive knowledge and technology exchange across sectors to strengthen existing remote operations capability in Australia;
- (c) to increase the speed with which Australian entities create value through application of remote operations products and services;
- (d) to build and advocate for Australian capability in remote operations;
- (e) to advance end-to-end technologies, systems and models that redefine what assets can be operated remotely and expand the addressable markets;
- (f) to direct collaborative research, development and commercialisation activities which can be solved at least in part by remote operations capabilities;
- (g) to facilitate access to markets both domestic and international;
- (h) to facilitate workforce development in pursuit of the Company's objects; and
- (i) to promote the objects of the Company in any manner the Board considers appropriate, and to do things incidental or conducive to the attainment of these objects.

The activities of AROSE will be guided by the principles of:

- Bias to Action
- Technical and Commercial Integrity
- Respect, Diversity and Collaboration
- Focus, Efficiency and Effectiveness

The by-laws of the Company will be referred to as the Consortium Rules which will be finalised in March 2020.
